

PROTEST SHIELD PROJECT

with artist in residence miguel horn

Artist Miguel Horn worked with the youth artist program to create a workshop that was part of his exhibition Dissonance; An exploration of the Cazerolazos and the violent climate between Venezuela's government and it's people. In the workshop, the youth artists learned about how young Venezuelans are protesting against the current regime by going out into the streets and protecting themselves with shields that they make from recycled materials. Artist Miguel Horn himself created a series of shields using the CAD design system to map out the construction of his shields. The CAD system then translated the measurements of his pieces and sent the information to a laser cutter to process and cut the material. The youth artist program took a trip to NextFab to see the laser cutter in action!

YAP also took a trip to Miguel Horn's studio at The Traction Company in West Philadelphia where they designed their own shields and had them cut with a jigsaw. The shields were first put on display for the Philadelphia Free Streets Festival. This was a festival celebrating Philadelphia's vibrant and diverse communities throughout the the street corridor. The shields were accompanied by a Cacerolazo (a gathered protest where people make noise with pots & pans) to display solidarity with the Venezuelan youth and their desire to build a brighter future for their nation.

JAIME ALVAREZ

WORKSHOP

YAP had the opportunity to work with Jaime Alvarez in a workshop based on his exhibition Consumption. Jaime created a series of large-scale photographs of found and discarded objects that explores intimacy, sentimentality, and loss. It was his first solo show at Taller and the project stemmed from his 2016 residency at RAIR (Recycled Artist in Residency), which operates out of a recycling center in North Philadelphia. Through manipulating found objects and photographing them, Alvarez involves himself in a process where he brings new life to what some might consider to be garbage.

The youth artists had a chance at constructing compositions and learning about how Jaime lights his subjects and stages for a series of pictures. With a series of left over objects from Jaime's studio, the youth artists were able to construct their own narratives with the objects and participate in a recorded interview with jaime about why they chose the object and what visual narrative they are hoping to tell.
